San Francisco is changing the focus of this case []

[] to an in-
vestigation of an individual as a possible source of informa-
tion in regards to Soviet activities. It is felt that if
the Subject does not become a source of information, this
case should be closed. *100-204*

In this light, UACB, San Francisco will not
submit a report or LHM regarding the Subject.

The following is the method by which San Francisco
will attempt to reestablish contact with the Subject in order
to determine if he is still willing to cooperate with the FBI
on a confidential basis. *100-204*

SA JAMES DUNPHY, who has known GOODLETT for many
years, will contact him initially. Subsequent contacts by
DUNPHY may be necessary over a period of several months
before the agent, who will ultimately deal with GOODLETT,
is introduced to him. It is felt that the preliminary con-
tacts by DUNPHY are of the utmost importance. San Francisco
further believes that GOODLETT should not be contacted
unless the contact is pertinent and specific. That is,
GOODLETT, due to his personality, occupations, philosophy
of world affairs, and his community status, should not be
contacted on a regular 30 day basis at this stage of
development. San Francisco envisions eventually utilizing
GOODLETT as a confidential source and has no intention of
directing his activities at this time. For the present, San
Francisco will only advise the Subject of the Bureau's

If this matter becomes successful at some time in the future (San Francisco is not prepared to forecast how long this development might take), it is possible that several months might pass before subsequent contacts between GOODLETT and the Agent take place. This is being set forth so that we will not delude ourselves into thinking that the Subject will cooperate in a manner similar to other sources of the San Francisco Division. It is recognized that the Subject has other idealistic goals in regards to the betterment of blacks and world pacification which, for him, are of a higher priority. ~~(S)~~

San Francisco is giving careful consideration to the immediate initial approach to the Subject. Sufficient care will be given in effort to determine that Subject is not a plant and in no way will act to the detriment of the Bureau. ~~(S)~~

Until 8/31/73, San Francisco was not able to contact the Subject as he was away from the city part of the time; and secondly, the occasion did not arise in which SA JAMES DUNPHY could logically contact the Subject on a friendly, personal basis.

On 8/31/73, it was noticed in the "Black Panther", a weekly newspaper, dated 8/25/73, that the following articles were printed:

"Editorial

"THE ENEMY WITHIN

"With this issue of THE BLACK PANTHER we inaugurate 'Inside Out', a weekly column devoted to uncovering the enemy within. (See page 6.)

"Much thought and discussion preceeded the decision to carry 'Inside Out'. We anticipated much negative reaction. 'Why descend to the level of the enemy by rumor mongering and smearing', many will ask. 'Isn't this a time for unity; Black brother and sisterhood and love', others will ask. 'Shouldn't we be concentrating on the real enemy -- the American empire builders?', yet others will wonder.

"We must never forget that the most dangerous enemy of the revolution is the hidden traitor. He or she is much more dangerous than the monster enemy standing in full view, arrogant and formidable. We are alert to the monster enemy's plan. We are constantly arming ourselves -- ideologically, theoretically and organizationally -- against it. We are fast gaining knowledge and understanding of its strategy and tactics and developing our own to face and defeat it.

"But the hidden enemy, mouthing the rhetoric of Blackness and liberation, giving of himself or herself to the struggle with fake sincerity and mock concern, most often elludes us, escapes our attention. Our own deep sincerity, honest concern and abiding trust shields such individuals; provides for them a cover under which they are able to do their dirt.

"It is their dirt that "Inside Out" will expose. What appears in "Inside Out" is not rumor. We will do our homework. You can be sure what we print has basis in fact. Selfish, individual accumulation of money and the material things of life in the name of Black liberation is our target.

"This is a time for unity and we work hard and consistently for Black and oppressed people's unity. But we work equally hard against unity with those from among us who allow their greed to push them into the enemy's camp; who use the people's pain and suffering for their gain. No empire CAN be built without such aid and assistance. Therefore, by uncovering and exposing the hidden traitor, we are inflicting severe blows on the monster enemy and its ability to succeed in its plans.

"It is the poor, the oppressed and the exploited for whom we exist. We negate our own individuality in their intrest. We are one with them. We ARE them. THIS IS LOVE. Join us in our total devotion and your name will never appear in 'Inside Out'."

"INSIDE OUT

"Hard-pressed Black tenants of West Oakland's Acorn projects are up-in-arms about an attempt by owners of the cheaply constructed, predominantly Black housing complex to raise their rents by 17 per cent. Beneficial Development financed the lousy construction job. This Black-owned outfit is the baby of Carlton P. ✓ Goodlett, editor-publisher of San Francisco's Black weekly, THE SUN REPORTER and alleged champion of Black and poor people's causes. Present owners claim rent increases are necessary to meet maintenance cost. But, if the initial construction job had met even minimum standards, maintenance would have not been so expensive. An example: No rain gutters were installed for the nearly 700 unit project."

On the same date, SA DUNPHY met with GOODLETT to discuss the above article with him. GOODLETT stated that he had not seen the article as he does not usually read the "Black Panther" newspaper. He was quite interested in the article and read it very closely. It was noted by SA DUNPHY that GOODLETT was cooperative and polite. GOODLETT stated that it was his feeling that the derogatory nature of the article was due to his not endorsing the Black Panther Party or Bobby Seale in the last two elections.

Information set forth below was furnished on October 23, 1973, by a source who has furnished reliable information in the past. Source learned on the above mentioned date that Carlton Benjamin Goodlett at the last minute had decided to attend a World Congress for International Security and Disarmament, National Independence, Cooperation and Peace, sponsored by the World Peace Council, which is scheduled to be held in Moscow, USSR, October 25-31, 1973. (S) (U)

Source noted that Goodlett was scheduled to fly from San Francisco on October 24, 1973.

The World Peace Council was formed at the conclusion of the Second World Peace Congress held in Warsaw, Poland, November 16-25, 1950, under communist initiative. It continues today as a major international effort to discredit the U.S. Its headquarters are at Helsinki, Finland.

Carlton Benjamin Goodlett was born July 23, 1914, at Chipley, Florida. He presently resides at 2060 O'Farrell Street, Apartment 309, San Francisco. He is a physician and surgeon with offices at 1360 Turk Street, San Francisco, California. He is also the owner and publisher of the "Sun Reporter", a weekly newspaper published in San Francisco, California.

A second source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised during November, 1945, that Carlton Goodlett was a member of the Communist Party. (S) (U)

San Francisco is closing this matter and offers the following observations:

SA JAMES DUNPHY of the San Francisco Division knows GOODLETT better than any other Agent in the Bureau. He knows GOODLETT personally and GOODLETT will speak to him on the street in a friendly manner when they happen to meet.

When they last met, as reported in re letter, the opportunity did not present itself for an approach. If GOODLETT believed the meeting between himself and DUNPHY was anything other than a friendly chat, he did not indicate this, nor did he allow the conversation to turn so that DUNPHY could direct the conversation. This meeting did not produce the positive results that San Francisco had hoped for, nor has there been an opportunity to recontact GOODLETT on the discreet basis which SA DUNPHY thinks is necessary.

San Francisco believes this case should be closed with the idea that SA DUNPHY will remain alert to recontact GOODLETT on a friendly, personal basis.

The only other alternative is for San Francisco to directly interview GOODLETT and sound him out as to any possible cooperation with the FBI. It is felt at this time:

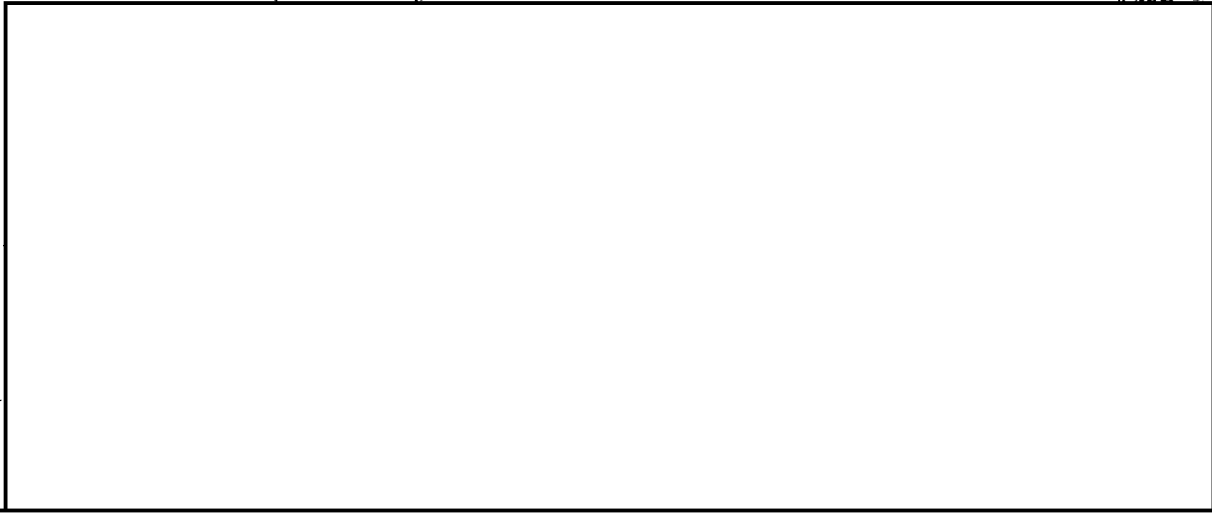

The results of those name checks were summarized in memoranda dated June 11, 1969, and October 12, 1972, captioned "Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett." Copies of those two memoranda are attached.

Since that time, Carlton Benjamin Goodlett, M.D., a Negro physician-surgeon whose affiliated position is owner and publisher of the Negro newspaper "Sun Reporter" in San Francisco, California, continues to be the subject of a security-type investigation conducted by this Bureau. Born July 23, 1914, at Chipley, Florida, he resides at 2060 O'Farrell Street, Apartment 309, San Francisco, California. Dr. Goodlett has been known since November 20, 1945, to be a member of the Communist Party (CP).

(100-352389) MRS CARLTON BENJAMIN GOODLETT

In recent years, Dr. Goodlett has become known as an international pacifist and flew to Moscow in December, 1972, as a leading figure in the antiwar movement in America. He is a member of the Presidential Committee of the Soviet-dominated World Peace Council for Peace, an organization with an international effort to discredit the United States.

In 1973, he was known to be divorced from Willette K. Goodlett, nee Hill, born June 17, 1915.

A recorded radio broadcast speech attributed to Dr. Carlton Goodlett of the "USA" was heard from Hanoi on January 23, 1973. The broadcast reported their viewing of the damage caused by intensified U.S. bombings upon the innocent and poor people in Vietnam.

Foreign Political Matters - Cuba

Granma reported as follows:

"On the morning of April 12, a group from the black press of the United States who had been touring our country for 13 days held a press conference at the headquarters of the Journalists Union of Cuba."

"Dr. Carlton B. Goodlet, president of the National Newspaper Publisher's Association-Black Press of America, and who is also on the presidium of the World Peace Council, condemned the attack on our fishermen and said that members of the group lamented the fact that a Cuban fisherman would have been killed and two boats sunk. He added that theirs was a peaceful delegation and that they were well aware that this was but one in a long series of provocations. They proffered their condolences to the relatives of the victims."

"In a brief introduction to the press conference, Goodlet stressed how the stay in Cuba had impressed the whole group - of 16 people, comprising mostly journalists, but also men of letters, lawyers, doctors, and leaders of religious groupings and of mass organizations - and he said that they would be reporting on what they have seen in articles in the U.S. black press."

"He explained that the objective of the group was to build a bridge of friendship between the peoples of Cuba and of the United States; totally independent of official policy; they felt that this could be accomplished by giving publicity to the facts about life in Cuba."

"Dr. Goodlet pointed out that this is not the first delegation from the U.S. black press to visit Cuba. A group visited Cuba in the early '60s, but when they returned they were subjected to FBI and CIA investigation; their efforts to promote more visits to Cuba - which was their objective - failed therefore."

"The visitors said that young blacks in the United States were very much alarmed over the war in Vietnam and closely followed the struggle of the Portuguese colonies in Africa."

"Regarding the victory of the MPLA in the war against the South African racists, who were backed up by the government of the United States, they said that Cuba's aid to the MPLA was greatly appreciated by black America because it constitutes an example of international solidarity on the part of Cuba, a country on the road of socialist construction; Cuba's action shows that peace and freedom are inseparable."

Foreign Political Matters - Cuba

"Goodlet, speaking on behalf of the members of the group, said that they spent 13 magnificent days in what he called our hard-working nation. They had been amazed by the manner in which Cuba had been able to enrich the potential of the nation, eliminate unemployment and illiteracy, build up the educational system right from the time of the literary campaign, initiate child care and carry out tremendous work in the field of health care."

"During the press conference they answered questioned about the position of blacks as to the coming U.S. elections, denouncing the divisionist policy of provocation against the black people carried out by Ford, Reagan, Jackson, Carter and other candidates, Democrats and Republicans alike."

"They also mentioned U.S. policy in Africa where Washington has supported colonialist and racist regimes; they firmly maintain that U.S. support for South African is equivalent to backing Nazi Germany."

"In view of the present international situation, it was their opinion that the process of detente was important. Opposition to it has become a subject for electoral propaganda due to the Reagan campaign, which reflects the views of former Secretary of Defense James Schlesinger and a large group of influential people in the United States backed by the conservatives press; they promote the idea that the U.S. must negotiate from positions of strength. The group, however, felt that the country must reduce tension with the Soviet Union because it is essential that huge defense budgets also be reduced. The mass movement, which demands a cut in military expenditure and a reallocation of that money into improving the cities, building homes and creating jobs and to the overall benefit of the people, must be heeded."
