Recommendation

It is recommended that the subject be removed from the SI of the NYO and be placed in the Reserve Index A in view of her inactivity with a CP front since 1963. It is felt the subject is no longer dangerous to the national security of the US.

NY is not recommending Mrs. ABZUG be interviewed since she is a candidate for a high political office and since she commands a ready platform to spread her ideas. In such a delicate situation, there seems to be a greater than usual risk of embarrassment to the Buréau.

I have also heard that Mrs. Abzug is or has been registered with the Foreign Agents Office of the Department of Justice as the agent of a communist bloc country and that she has travelled to various communist countries.

It is very difficult if not impossible for a voter to research these stories and to determine how much is true and how much false. Many of the records of your Department are, In know, confidential and their contents cannot be disclosed to the public. I would greatly appreciate, however, your sending me whatever information you may have of a non-confidential character which bears on the subjects I have mentioned in this letter or in any way relates to Mrs. Abzug's past and present associations, utterances, activities, etc. Such information would help the voters in the 19th C.D. decide whether to suppor or oppose Mrs. Abzug.

Barely six weeks remain to November 3rd. Your promptness in replying to this inquiry would be a distinct public service to the voters in my district.

Reference is made to the 4/8/71 memorandum from Mr. Rosen to Mr. Sullivan, "Surveillances of Senators, and Congressmen," advising that based upon recollection of personnel at the Seat of Government we are checking files of any member of Congress who was the subject of a case under investigation. 1 thought you would be interested in knowing the following concerning Representative Bella S. Abzug (D-NY). Although this information pertains to a period well before she was elected to Congress (11/70), it may be pertinent in view of current publicity that she has joined with others who are making the unfounded allegations against the Bureau concerning surveillances of Senators and Congressmen.

Physical surveillances were conducted at Abzug's home during the evening hours of 1/5, 11, 17, 30/62; no activity discerned. At the time she was the subject of security investigations tion by us because of communist connections and was included on the Security Index (deleted from Index 10/70). On 7/22/59 advised that a Soviet telephonically contacted Abzug and they made arrangements to meet at the USSR delegation to the United Nations in New York City. Abzug indicated she was interested in traveling to the USSR.

On the same date, 7/22/59, our Agents observed Abzug exiting 680 Park Avenue, location of the USSR delegation be to the United Nath ons.

It should be significantly noted that incidents cited above were well prior to Abzug's election to Congress and, in connection with the Soviet contact, our information was obtained not relative to investigation of Abzug but rather incidental to our coverage of the Soviets.

Enclosed is a copy of H.Res. 410 introduced on 4-28-71 by Congresswoman Bella Abzug (D-N.Y.) for herself and 11 other Congressmen which would authorize and direct the House Committee on the Judiciary as a whole or a subcommittee to conduct a "full and complete investigation" of the FBI, including but not limited to the following areas:

A) The quality of the administration of the FBI including the ability of the Director.

- B) The activities of the agents and supervisors including but not limited to the manner of selection of cases, the method used to gather evidence and the reasons for choosing the method, and the use made of evidence gathered.
- C) The quality, quantity, and type of work done plus the accuracy of statistical reports.
 - D) Personnel policies and practices.

The resolution would authorize the Committee to use subpoena to require testimony and the production of books, records, etc., as deemed necessary. The resolution calls for the Committee to report to the House as soon as possible but not later than 42 days after the adoption of the resolution the results of its investigation and any recommendations.

REPRESENTATIVE BELLA ABZUG - DEMOCRAT - NEW YORK OTHER Mrs. Abzug, a first term Congresswoman, a reported former longtime member of Communist Party, USA, and a founder of Women's Strike for Peace (WSP). On 2-8-71, the People's Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ) held a press conference at Lafayette Park re President's policy in Vietnam and Laos. One of the speakers was Representative Abzug. She was also scheduled to appear at a press conference of this group held in a hearing room of Rayburn Horse Office Building on 3-1-71, but did not appear. On 3-5-71, the WSP held a demonstration in New York City. Representative Abzug, who addressed the demonstrators, criticized the President's Administration primarily on the war in Southeast Asia. She reportedly spoke of an anti-war coalition in Congress which would force withdrawal from Southeast Asia. According to newspaper reports, Representative Abzug is quite active in the so-called "peace" movements and take every opportunity to address demonstrators. at peace rallies. The "New York Times" of 2-14-71, carried an advertisement sponsored by the National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC) entitled "Stop the Escalation-Stop the War Now!" which called for demonstrations in April and May. This advertisement listed some 70 labor leaders, actors, writers and, 8 U.S. Congressmen, including Herman Badillo. On 4-9-71, a United Press International item indicated Representative Badillo urged Mr. Hoover to review the dismissal of Linda Janca and Christine Hoomes, volunteers for the National Peace Coalition, stating that Mr. Hoover "by demanding that they either give up their work with the coalition or resign. abused their rights as Federal employees and their rights as citizens," and termed it a "flagrant disregard for the constitutional rights of workers by an arm of the Government whose primary mission is to see that our constitution and laws are upheld."

REPRESENTATIVE SHIRLEY CHISHOLM - DEMOCRAT - NEW YORK

Representative Chisholm is serving her second term as a Congress-woman, and is the first black congresswoman ever to be elected, a fact of which she is obviously very proud. Representative Chisholm has attended meetings of the Emergency Conference to Defend the Rights of the Black Panther Party to Exist; has spoken at a rally sponsored by the Vietnam Peace Parade Committee and the New York Vietnam Moratorium Committee; and has pledged her support to Women's Union, a new women's liberation group which has launched a drive to raise \$100,000 for bail for a woman Black Panther awaiting trial in Manhattan.

REPRESENTATIVE JOSHUA EILBERG - DEMOCRAT - PENNSYLVANIA

Eilberg has been a member of Congress since 1967. In 1952 he was on the mailing lists of the Civil Rights Congress and the Progressive Party of Pennsylvania both cited as communist front groups. Relations with Representative Eilberg have been friendly.

REPRESENTATIVE SEYMOUR HALPERN - REPUBLICAN - NEW YORK

Halpern has been a member of Congress since 1959. On 9-10-59, Representative Halpern, his fiancee and her 10-year-old brother, were conducted on a tour and shook hands with the Director. Halpern again toured the Bureau and shook hands with the Director on 8-31-60.

In July and August, 1969, newspapers in the Washington, D.C., and New York areas, carried items indicating that Representative Halpern, a member of the House Banking and Currency Committee, had obtained an unsecured loan at favorable rates from a major New York City bank and later voted in Committee for legislation supported by that Bank.

REPRESENTATIVE EDWARD I. KOCH - DEMOCRAT - NEW YORK

Koch was first elected to Congress on 11-5-68. Koch was first contacted in connection with our program to meet new Congressmen on 2-18-69. At

that time he discussed a Bill he had introduced to make all Government files, including the FBI's, available to any individual named therein upon that individual's request. The confidential nature of our files and the problems involved in making them public were pointed out to him. Koch commented regarding an alleged rumor that phones in Congressional offices may be tapped by the FBI in the 12-17-70 "Congressional Record," stating he would not be surprised if this were true. Byltr 3-30-71, Representative Koch inquired as to whether our files under an individual's name are available to that individual for his personal inspection, and whether we had any files on him. He was advised of confidential nature of Bufiles and fact files not available for personal inspection by individuals named therein. He was also advised that he had never been a subject of an investigation by this Bureau.

REPRESENTATIVE PARREN J. MITCHELL - DEMOCRAT - MARYLAND

Mitchell is a first term Congressman. Representative Mitchell, formerly Executive Secretary of the Maryland Commission on Interracial Problems and Relations, and head of the Baltimore Community Action Agency, has spoken at rallies in support of open housing and other such activities. He has also attended various meetings of the Black United Front in the Baltimore area.

The 3-23-71 issue of the "Washington Post" carried an item indicating that black federal employees protesting alleged discriminatory government promotion practices held demonstrations at four agencies on 3-22. Representative Mitchell was one of speakers when nearly 150 people appeared at the Library of Congress.

REPRESENTATIVE DONALD W. RIEGLE, JR. - REPUBLICAN - MICHIGAN

Riegle was first elected to Congress in 1966. Riegle has identified himself with the anti-Vietnam forces and in 1967 gained considerable publicity from his exchange of correspondence with Ho Chi Minh. The "Congressional Record" of 3-5-70 carried remarks critical of the Director made by Representative Riegle in a speech in Houston, Texas. Riegle indicated that the Director should be replaced by a younger man and implied that the Director is to blame for the serious increase of crime and growth of organized crime activities.


REPRESENTATIVE BENJAMIN S. ROSENTHAL - DEMOCRAT - NEW YORK

Rosenthal won a special election on 2-20-62 and has been re-elected to subsequent Congresses. An article in the 3-15-68 "Washington Daily News" captioned "FBI and the IRS Can Tap 100 Million Private Credit Files" dealt with testimony being taken by Special Committee on the Invasion of Privacy. Representative Rosenthal, member of this committee, was quoted as saying, "If one of these men (IRS or FBI Agents) came into my office and asked about anything, but the weather I would tell them to get out. They have absolutely no right, none whatsoever to that information." Rosenthal previously, had been actively engaged in attempting to abolish the House Committee on UnAmerican Activities, and has participated in protest action against U.S. invovement in Vietnam. Rosenthal is also one of 6 Congressmen who accused the FBI of leaking information to the press in written form, carrying out a concerted campaign against them and maintaining files on individual Congressmen.
