

HAVANA — Philip Agee, a former CIA agent who became an outspoken critic of Washington's Cuba policy, has died in a Havana hospital after ulcer surgery, state media reported on Wednesday. He was 72.

Agee quit the CIA in 1969 after 12 years working mostly in Latin America at a time when leftist movements were gaining prominence and sympathizers. His 1975 book, *Inside the Company: CIA Diary*, cited alleged CIA misdeeds against leftists in the region that included a 22-page list of purported agency operatives.

Granma, Cuba's Communist Party newspaper, said Agee died Monday night and described him as "a loyal friend of Cuba and fervent defender of the peoples' fight for a better world."


Bemie Dwyer, a journalist with state-run Radio Havana, said in a Tuesday message posted to a Cuba e-mail group that Agee's wife called him to say he had died in the hospital, where he has he been since Dec. 15.

"He had several operations for perforated ulcers and didn't survive all the surgery," Dwyer wrote, adding that Agee was cremated Tuesday and that friends planned a memorial ceremony for him Sunday at his Havana apartment.

In 2000, with European investors and a state-run travel agent as his partners, Agee opened a travel Web site designed to bring U.S. tourists to Cuba. The site, cubalinda.com, offers package tours and other help with Cuban tourism that is largely off limits to Americans.

There was no word of Agee's death on the site Wednesday.



Agee was on the board along with such leftist notables as Marcus Raskin of the Institute for Policy Studies and Communist ACLU official Frank Donner. The former director of the ACLU's Project on Political Surveillance, Frank Donner was a member of the Communist Party USA (CPUSA) who traveled to Russia and had contacts with Russian espionage agents, according to his FBI file. He wrote several books attacking U.S. intelligence agencies, including the NSA. He especially hated the House Committee on Un-American Activities, which grilled him on his CPUSA activities. He took the Fifth. But Donner had the last laugh, as the committee and its successor, the House Committee on Internal Security, were abolished in the 1970s.

The Invisible Hand of F

The recent front-page "exposes" in the Wall Street Journal and the Washington Post of "mistakes" and "misleading statements" in the State Department's White Paper on Communist interference in El Salvador closely parallel an attack on the White Paper by CIA defector Philip Agee, who was in the national news last week when the Supreme Court upheld the right of the U.S. government to deny him an American passport on grounds that he is a danger to the national security of the U.S.

In telephone interviews with HUMAN EVENTS, Journal reporter Jonathan Kwitny and Post reporter Robert Kaiser both acknowledged that they consulted a detailed 46-page critique of the White Paper by Agee before their stories were published on June 8 and June 9. They deny that they passed off any of Agee's work as their own and, in fact, don't charge, as Agee does, that some of the captured Salvadoran guerrilla documents released with the White Paper were fabricated by the CIA. But Kwitny at one point referred to the

What Philip Agee said on April 9:

"I simply cannot understand why the White Paper analyst and Juan de Onis failed to understand that this was meant to be an internal Cuban report, except that if they described it as such, they would have been unable to explain how the report could have made its way into a 'document cache' in El Salvador."

"One has to wonder why, if the analyst mentioned 100 U.S. M-16 rifles captured in this incident, he only mentioned that 'several' were traced to Vietnam—instead of giving the exact number—especially since no M-16s appear on the Vietnam weapons list."







decision to concentrate on specific operations rather than types.

In Havana, the Biblioteca Nacional Jose Martí and the Casa de las Americas provided special assistance for research and helped find data available only from government documentation. Representatives of the Communist Party of Cuba also gave me important encouragement at a time when I doubted that I would be able to find the additional information I needed.

Several documentation centres in Paris gave me access to valuable research materials: the Bibliothèque Nationale the Bonismin D. . . .

Agee acknowledged help of Cuba in his 1975 book, *Inside the Company: CIA Diary.*

In January 1975 Agee published an uncompromisingly hostile memoir of his career in the CIA entitled *Inside the Company: CLA Diary*, which identified approximately 250 Agency officers and agents and claimed that "millions of people all over the world had been killed or had their lives destroyed by the CIA and the institutions it supports." The self-congratulatory KGB file on the book claims, doubtless with some exaggeration, that it was "prepared by Service A, together with the Cubans."

Mitrokhin's notes do not indicate exactly what the KGB and its Cuban ally, the DGI, contributed to Agee's text. As Agee himself acknowledged, however: "Representatives of the Communist Party of Cuba [the DGI] . . . gave important encouragement at a time when I doubted that I would be able to find the additional information I needed." While Agee was writing his book in Britain, the KGB maintained contact with him through its co-optee, Edgar Anatolyevich Cheporov, London correspondent of the Novosti news agency and the Literaturnaya Gazeta. At Service A's insistence, Agee removed all references to CIA penetration of Latin American Communist parties from his typescript before publication.

destabilize the CIA through exposure of its operations and personnel."⁶¹ Files noted by Mitrokhin claim that the *Bulletin* was founded "on the initiative of the KGB" and that the group running it (collectively codenamed RUPOR), which held its first meeting in Jamaica early in 1978, was "put together" by FCD Directorate K (counterintelligence). ⁶² The *Bulletin* was edited in Washington by Bill Schaap, a radical lawyer codenamed RUBY by the KGB, his wife, the journalist Ellen Ray, and another journalist, Louis Wolf, codenamed ARSENIO. Agee and two other disaffected former members of the CIA, Jim and Elsie Wilcott (previously employed by the Agency as, respectively, finance officer and secretary), contributed articles and information. ⁶³ There is no evidence in Mitrokhin's notes that any member of the RUPOR group, apart from Agee, was conscious of the role of the DGI or KGB.

Agee proved to be one of the most damaging CIA turncoats in history. The Cubans shared Agee's information with us. But as I sat in my office in Moscow reading reports about the growing list of revelations coming from Agee, I cursed our officers for turning away such a prize. I sent out orders for our stations to work carefully with such volunteers and reject them only after we were certain they were not genuine. In any event, the Cubans never let us forget that they were the ones who had discovered Agee. In the 1970s and 1980s they continued going after current and retired CIA officers and enjoyed some success, though none of the future recruits would ever be as spectacular as Agee. Senate conservatives proudly call themselves "Reagan Republicans" because of Reagan's "Peace Through Strength" military policies. But in Leon Panetta, whose nomination comes up for a full Senate vote for Secretary of Defense on Tuesday, they are being asked to endorse a man whose Congressional career was dedicated to fighting Reagan's defense buildup and anti-communist policies:

- Panetta in 1983 endorsed the nuclear weapons freeze, a concept backed by the Soviet Union which would have frozen in place a Soviet nuclear advantage in Europe.
- Panetta supported a ban on the testing and deployment of new nuclear ballistic missiles.
- Panetta opposed CIA covert operations to undermine the Communist Sandinista regime, calling Reagan's support for the Nicaraguan freedom fighters a "dirty war."
- Panetta opposed the neutron bomb, an enhanced radiation weapon designed to counter a Soviet tank build-up in Europe.
- Panetta opposed the B-1 bomber, which was funded under Reagan and is today a key part of the fleet.
- While most members of Congress were saluting Reagan and our troops for liberating Grenada, Panetta criticized the Reagan action and warned against the dispatch of a U.S. naval task force to the vicinity of Cuba. "This is not a time to seek out new targets to flex our military muscle," Panetta said.
- Panetta opposed the MX "Peacekeeper" missile, arguing it would jeopardize arms negotiations with the Soviets. Reagan had warned that defunding the system would "weaken our ability to deter war..."

On October 19, 1992, NYO determined that AGEE was scheduled to speak at the Movement for a People's Assembly (MPA) in New York City on November 5, 1992. The MPA is affiliated with the International Action Center (IAC), the Hands-Off Cuban Coalition, and various other activist groups. Agents from NYO attended the lecture in a light undercover role. AGEE recounted his CIA career and the CIA alleged involvement in overseas labor unions. During a question and answer period that followed AGEE's speech. AGEE specifically denied receiving money from either Cuba or the former USSR. AGEE further stated that he had obtained a German passport through the efforts of his wife. AGEE stated he purposely remained outside the U.S. for approximately 15 years after his resignation from the CIA out of fear of being prosecuted. In the late 1980's, AGEE returned to the U.S. for a speaking tour and, since U.S. law enforcement did not bother him he had since frequently returned to the U.S. AGEE also stated that he had obtained through the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) documents which proved that the CIA illegally tried to have him assassinated. AGEE contended that since the CIA knows that he has these documents, the U.S. Government will not attempt to prosecute him. AGEE stated that he was planning to return to the U.S. in February, 1993.

After the MPA meeting, AGEE was surveilled to 55 Cooper Street, New York, New York. Subsequent investigation by NYO revealed that AGEE has Apartment 6-B at that address registered in his own name. NYO is currently attempting to obtain additional information concerning that apartment.

Agee is working with U.S. "activist groups." In 1980s, U.S. law enforcement "did not bother him." The International Action Center is a Workers World Party front.





During the Carter Administration, the KGB continued to write its own anti-U.S. stories at the Center in Moscow and have those stories published in the United States. Some KGB materials were published by the nonprofit public educational organization "American Documentary Cinema," which was located at 336 West 84th Street, in New York. This organization also had a branch in San Francisco. Other materials were printed in the Russian language newspaper Novoye Russkoye Slovo in New York, which was one of the periodical publications controlled by the New York Residency.


