

AMERICA'S SURVIVAL, INC. 2008 YEAR-END REPORT

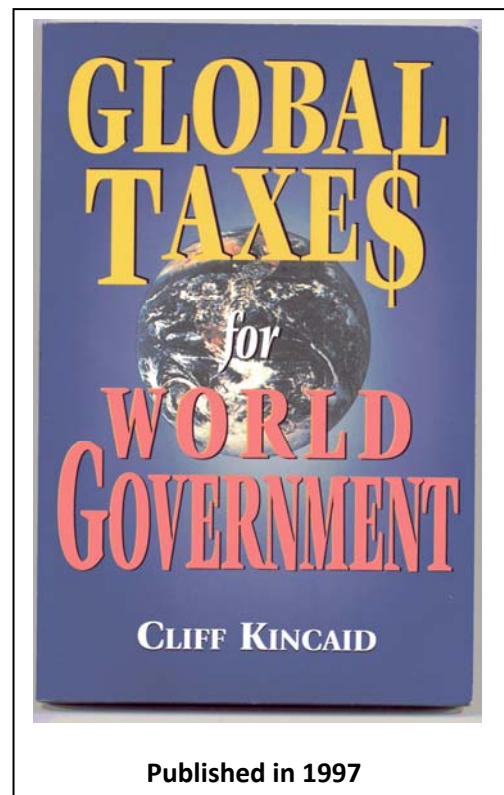
“I think the formation of some sort of world government is plausible.”

This was the conclusion of Gideon Rachman of the London Financial Times in a December 8, 2008, dispatch headlined “And now for a World Government.” What this journalist wrote about in a mainstream publication is what America's Survival, Inc. (ASI) has been warning about in books and reports for over a decade. ASI is the nation's leading U.N. and foreign policy watchdog organization and runs the popular websites www.usasurvival.org and www.stopglobaltaxes.org

“So, it seems, everything is in place,” wrote Rachman, after examining the crisis in global financial affairs and other areas. “For the first time since homo sapiens began to doodle on cave walls, there is an argument, an opportunity and a means to make serious steps towards a world government.”

Rachman focused some of his attention on the Managing Global Insecurity (MGI) project, which we examined in our latest report, “Obama to Usher in China-dominated New Global Order.” The MGI report argues for “responsible sovereignty” on the part of the U.S. in foreign affairs.

ASI believes, however, that this sovereignty-destroying global agenda can be beaten back. Major parts of what is being called “global governance” can only be accomplished through passage of various United Nations treaties, which require 67 votes in the Senate. In addition, a movement toward “global governance” or world government is sure to generate a public backlash.



In 2008, ASI conducted two major public education campaigns:

- A project to expose the U.N. Convention on the Law of the Sea, and
- A project to educate the public about the influence and activities of Communist agents in America, including members of the terrorist Weather Underground and Frank Marshall Davis, who was Barack Obama's childhood mentor.

Our work on the Davis story broke important ground and we even obtained and posted the 600-page FBI file on his communist and subversive activities. The entry on our website concerning "Communism in America" has an extraordinary collection of anti-communist congressional reports and other information on communist networks in Chicago and Hawaii and across the U.S.

As a result of our work in this area, we are currently following up on several leads regarding the work of communist operatives in public policy.

The Law of the Sea Treaty project included a series of newspaper and TV ads and briefings for Congressional staff, activists, and members of Congress. Working with a coalition of groups, the treaty was stopped from coming to a vote. But it will be back in 2009, along with several others.

The communism in America project included a news conference on Capitol Hill, the hiring of a public relations firm to arrange media interviews, Internet ads on Newsmax.com and other sites, and the production of more than a dozen special reports. Cliff Kincaid, Herbert Romerstein, and Andrew Walden, who wrote a special report for ASI on Frank Marshall Davis and his bizarre sexual activities, did literally dozens of radio interviews on the subject. Our work was picked up by hundreds of media and Internet outlets and was even included in two major books on Obama.

ASI is planning a major conference in early 2009 to examine the nature of the "progressive" movement, on a domestic and global basis, and its influence on the Obama Administration. One of our most recent reports, written by veteran investigator Herbert Romerstein, examined the history of the "progressive" movement in America from the time of Henry Wallace through the Weather Underground and figures like William Ayers. Romerstein will be continuing this work for us.

In this context, it is interesting to note that, on the Rag Blog website, former Weather Underground member Mark Rudd makes some revealing remarks, defending the "conservative appointments" of President-elect Obama and saying that they are part of a deliberate strategy to "feint to the right" and "move left." He explains, "Any other strategy invites sure defeat." Rather than immediately propose cutting the military budget, for example, Rudd suggests that Obama will pursue security "through diplomacy and application of nascent international law" and lay the groundwork for eventual defense cuts.

Rudd also declares that left-wingers questioning Obama's cabinet picks should "Look to the second level appointments. There's a whole govt. in waiting that Podesta has at the Center for American Progress. They're mostly progressives, I'm told (except in military and foreign policy). Cheney was extremely effective at controlling policy by putting his people in at second-level positions." Podesta is John Podesta, a co-chair of the Obama-Biden Transition Team, who runs the George Soros-funded Center for American Progress.

It is significant that former Weather Underground members Rudd, Jeff Jones, Bill Ayers and Bernardine Dohrn are all now working through an organization called Movement for a Democratic Society (MDS), which is operating as "a parent body for Progressives for Obama." We have commissioned a report on this movement.

Jeff Jones of the Weather Underground, who says he voted for Obama, openly advertises his past on his own website, as well as his current activities in the firm "Jeff Jones Strategies."

Under the "Protest" section he even includes an FBI mug shot and his fingerprints. It declares, "As a leader of the Weather Underground, Jeff evaded an intense FBI manhunt for more than a decade. In 1981, they finally got him. Twenty special agents battered down the door of the Bronx apartment where he was living with his wife and four-year-old son."

Jones said that he was arrested in October of 1981 but was only in jail for a couple of weeks. He said he was "not really guilty of all that much" and got community service and probation after pleading guilty to an explosives possession charge.

Larry Grathwohl, the former FBI informant in the Weather Underground, recalls that Jones was a member of the Central Committee of the Weather Underground and that other members were Bill Ayers, Bernardine Dohrn and Mark Rudd. He thinks Jones got off easy because the FBI had used extra-legal tactics to track him down and that most of the case against him was thrown out.

However, Grathwohl says that Jones' fingerprints were found in a San Francisco apartment around the time of the Park Police station bombing in 1970 that killed police officer Brian V. McDonnell. "It was never clearly stated that Jeff was an active participant in the Park Police station bombing, but he was in the area at the time it took place," Grathwohl says. The bomb included industrial metal staples that ripped through McDonnell and other injured officers.

He also notes that Jones was one of four authors of the Weather Underground statement, *Prairie Fire: The Politics of Revolutionary Anti-Imperialism*, which was dedicated to Robert F. Kennedy's killer Sirhan Sirhan and others. The other authors were listed as Billy Ayers, Bernardine Dohrn, and Celia Sojourn.

Grathwohl is preparing a special report on the Weather Underground movement for ASI.

Jones, who says that he has since "rebuilt my life," includes a photo on his website of him and New York First Lady Michelle Paterson at the Healthy Schools Gala in the New York Times building in New York City on May 12, 2008. In addition to the Healthy Schools Network, his clients include the Natural Resources Defense Council.

Jones offered the opinion, when asked, that Obama is "not a Marxist."

Rudd says that "progressives" should take hope in lower-level appointments. But we have noted that Hillary Clinton, the nominee as Secretary of State, and Susan Rice, the nominee as U.N. Ambassador, are close friends with Strobe Talbott, president of the "liberal" Brookings Institution. Rice worked for Talbott at Brookings and before that they worked together in the Clinton Administration. Hillary and Bill Clinton are old friends of Talbott. The book *Comrade J* charges that Talbott was a trusted contact of the Russian intelligence service when he served in the Clinton Administration. It is also very troubling that former Clinton official Anthony Lake was such a close adviser to Obama for two years. Lake had expressed doubts that Alger Hiss was a Soviet spy. What does this relationship say about Obama's ability -- or unwillingness -- to recognize national security problems and threats?

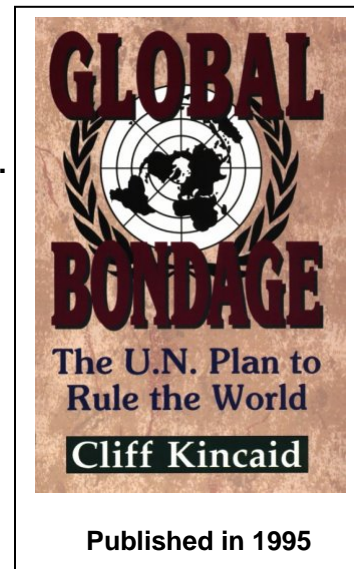
Another of Talbott's associates, Vicki Huddleston, is a member of the Obama-Biden transition team dealing with the Department of State. She was a visiting fellow in foreign policy studies at the Brookings Institution and her field of expertise is supposed to be Latin America and Africa. She is critical of our "isolationist" policy toward Cuba, favors establishing diplomatic relations with the Communist state, and believes that U.S. companies should help develop Cuba's

offshore oil resources. This is troubling because Obama had claimed during the campaign that his Cuba policy would be based on demanding freedom for the Cuban people.

A leftward policy drift was already apparent before Obama's election. Documents seized from the communist Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC) demonstrated that the communist narco-terrorist group has been receiving support from anti-American Hugo Chavez of Venezuela. The documents show that a FARC agent referred to "the proposal of the gringos," linked to the "new president of their country"-- that is, Obama, who opposes a free trade agreement with Colombia and the U.S. military aid program for its anti-communist government. We don't know who the "gringos" were, but their obvious plan is to undermine the pro-American government of Colombia and bolster the anti-American regime in Venezuela.

This raises the specter of America continuing to face humiliation and defeat around the world while being integrated further into a New Global Order under the growing influence of China. This is why ASI's work, in order to analyze and counter this trend, is so important.

Jimmy Carter was a friendly face who gave us the Panama Canal giveaway and the rise of the religious anti-American fanatics in Iran. A Russian warship used the Panama Canal for the first time since World War II on December 6, after taking part in joint Russian-Venezuelan maneuvers. The Iranian regime, supported by Russia, continues to present a threat and brazenly killed our troops in Iraq without a concerted response from the Bush Administration, which also seemed flummoxed by the Iranian regime's pursuit of nuclear weapons. Plus, the war in Afghanistan seems unwinnable, in part because our "allies" refuse to provide the troops necessary to help us win it. These serious national security problems are being passed to the Obama Administration. And there is no reason to believe the Obama Administration will resolve any of them in our favor.



Before Messrs. Wright and Ayers, though, there was "Frank," the name Obama gives in his memoirs to a man he describes as a formative influence during his early years in Hawaii. It turns out this Frank was none other than Frank Marshall Davis, a Stalinist black Communist whom the inestimably valuable Cliff Kincaid (www.usasurvival.org), has identified as a "high-level operative in a Soviet-sponsored network in Hawaii," which "the communists had targeted...largely because of its strategic location and importance to the U.S. defense effort." Kincaid describes Davis as a "propagandist, racial agitator and recruiter for the Communist Party of the USA."
