AFFIDAVIT OF DAVID G. EVANS

1. David G. Evans, being sworn, declares under penalty of perjury: I am personally familiar with the facts stated in this Affidavit and, if sworn as a witness, I am competent to testify to them as well.

2. I am an attorney in good standing of the bar of New Jersey. I have a law office in New Jersey but I live at 144 Boomhower Rd., Lyon Mountain, Clinton County, New York where I am now.

3. I was deployed to Detroit as part of the Republican Lawyers's effort to oversee a fair election process in Wayne County Michigan where Detroit is located.

4. On election day November 3, 2020, I was assigned to be a poll watcher. I used as guidance the attached "The Appointment, Rights and Duties of Election Challengers and Poll Watchers" that was provided by the Michigan Department of State Bureau of Elections, October 2020. (Exhibit 1). As a poll watcher I was not required to be registered to vote in Michigan. (Exhibit 1, page.12).

5. On election day I was initially assigned to visit the following locations.

Westland City Clerk, 36300, Warren Rd., Westland, MI
New St. Paul Tabernacal, 15340 Southfield at Grand River

Edison School, 17045 Grand River at Southfield
Gethsemane Church, 17701 Glendale at Southfield
New Providence Baptist Church, 18211 Plymouth Rd. At Southfield Expressway.

6. Later in the day I was asked to go to the District 6, Precinct 1 polling place at Dozier Recreation Center in Inkster Michigan in response to a complaint that US Congresswoman Rashida Tlaib was electioneering at the polling place.

7. I was also asked to check to see that a ballot drop box was properly emptied and locked at 8 PM on election day. The address of the drop box was 17160 Greenfield, Detroit MI positioned outside Liberty Temple Baptist Church.

8. On November 4, 2020, I was asked to go to the Detroit Department of Elections Central Counting Board in Detroit. I believe this is also called the "COBO Hall."

My observations

9. In the New Providence Baptist Church polling place they allowed people to vote in their car. When voters entered the parking lot to the church there was a sign that said "vote in car" and the voter was directed to a tent. I observed a young woman talking to the voters and then taking papers from them and then walking into the polling place. I saw her walk up to the lady who was giving out ballots and I saw her putting the papers down in front of her and then getting a ballot. I could see a driver's license included in the papers she was presenting from the voter. When she got the ballot she walked it out to the voter. I saw her do this repeatedly and later in the day I saw another poll worker doing the same thing. I contacted the legal hotline and was told that this was illegal and that they were sending an attorney. The attorney arrived and met with the election officials and told them this was not proper. I am not versed in the law in this regard and cannot opine as to its legality. I can only tell what I saw. I was informed by the attorney that

voting in the car is allowed but only if Republican and Democrat election workers oversaw the process. That was not done. The young woman was not wearing ID. The tent with the “vote in car” sign had way too many people to be just poll workers- it looked like a general hang out area and who knows what was going on there.

10. At the Edison School, I saw a Democrat Election Challenger sitting near the entrance talking to voters and giving them direction by pointing. I spoke to the head Democrat Challenger and made him aware that challengers are not permitted to speak to voters or to assist them.

11. I was asked to go to the District 6, Precinct 1 polling place in response to a complaint that US Congresswoman Rashida Tlaib was electioneering at the polling place. When I arrived she has left already but a Rev. Frantz, a minister, who was there and spoke to her confirmed that she was there and he showed me the spot where she stood and it was within 100 feet of the door of the polling place. He was evasive as to what she said but he did say “she was greeting voters.”

12. At the District 6, Precinct 1 polling place I saw two Democrat Challengers talking to voters and assisting them including one Challenger walking down the hall with a group of voters in an animated conversation. I spoke to an election official about this.

13. The County had a series of boxes in the county to drop off ballots. I went to the Westland City Hall to observe the unpacking and counting of these ballots. I was told by the person in charge that I could only sit in two places. One place was out in a hall where I could see nothing. The other place was in a room that had a high counter that I could not see over. I could see nothing. The unloading was done by a group of college kids. I inquired as to their political party and no one said they were there as Republicans. Earlier in the day at this location I saw a
